## Linking Hands




- Sew four Squedges together to make a unit.
- Refer to the diagrams for fabric placement.
- Make a total of 54 units.

- Sew two units together to make a diamond.
- Follow the diagrams carefully.
- Sew the diamonds into rows.
- Sew the rows together to make the hexagon top.

## Freezer Paper Appliques

- Trace the applique shapes onto freezer paper.
- Trace six diamonds and seven hexagons.
- Iron the freezer paper shapes onto the back of the fabric.
- Cut the fabric $1 / 4$ " from the paper edge.

- Wrap the fabric around the paper piece. Glue stick in place.
- For the diamonds, only two sides need to be wrapped as the raw edge will be covered with the binding.
- Applique the hexagons over the openings as shown.
- Applique the diamonds to the outside edge as shown.


## Finishing

- Layer the backing, batting and top.
- Baste the layers together.
- Quilt as desired.
- Bind with the $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ binding strips.



## Time Saving Tips

- One way to save time cutting is to leave your $71 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip folded. Cut the squedge pieces two at a time. You'll be getting mirror images without worrying about flipping over the tool.
- Note: If you use the above method with batiks, remember the fabric looks the same on both sides.
- Don't like to applique? You can avoid this step by sewing triangles to the units. For more information on this technique, refer to the free hexagon patterns on the web site: PhilllipsFiberArt.com.
- Eliminate the outer row for a smaller project.
Make only the 12 AD and 12 AE units.
- Add borders from six $21 / 2$ " x 33 " strips to make a larger project.
