

# 3-D Attic Window Ornament

An ornament that doubles as a stocking! Who wouldn't like a little extra candy? Slip a treat into either side of this double sided ornament with the fun pockets created with the Attic Window technique!

Finished size: 3 1/4" x 3 1/4"

Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
A	3/4 yd	2 Attic Window triangles
B	1/4 yd	one 4" square
C	1/4 yd	one 4" square
ribbon	4 - 5"	about 4 - 5"
batting	3/8 yd	one 4" square

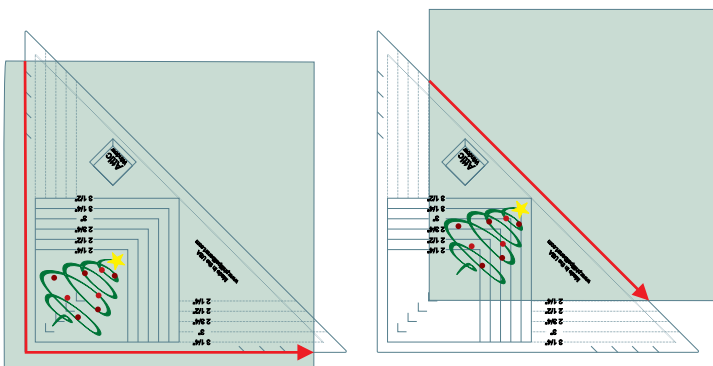
## Suggested Fabric

For the window, fabric A, choose a novelty print, or create your own unique design with an applique or embroidery. Placement of the motif is shown in the pattern.



## Window Panes

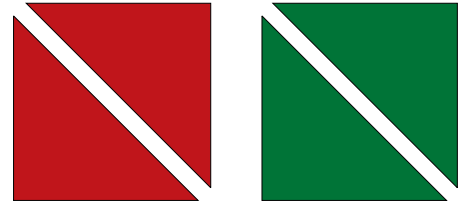
- Cut two window pane triangles from the A Fabric using the 2 1/4" size on the Attic Window Tool.
- Align the print in the window of the tool as shown.
- Trim along the edge of your tool
- Move the fabric to align to the 2 1/4" lines.
- Trim along the angled edge.



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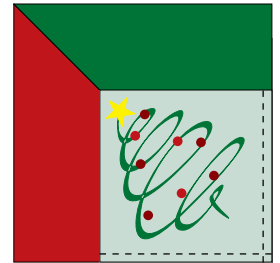
## Window Frames

- Cut the B and C Fabric squares in half diagonally.



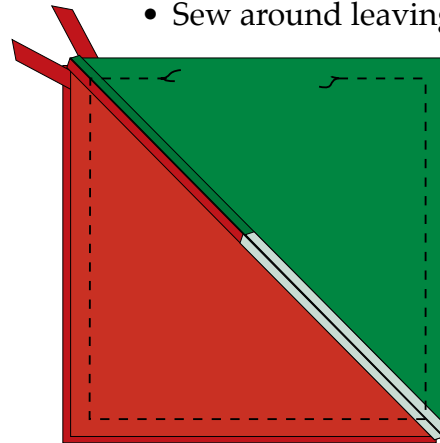
## Attic Window Squares

- Assemble the Attic Window squares as shown in the booklet accompanying the Attic Window tool.
- Baste the window in place an 1/8" from the edge.
- Make two.



## Attic Window Blocks

- Layer the first pieced block (right side up), hang ribbon and the second pieced block (right side down).
- Sew around leaving a small opening.



- Snip the corners
  - Turn the block inside out.
- You may add stuffing for a more 3 dimensional look.*
- Hand stitch the opening closed.



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
